Foodbank Visit

Some year 6 children visited the Foodbank this week. They were invited to go as they had donated their Enterprise profits from last year to it.



The Foodbank

The Foodbank was truly amazing; there were tonnes of food, boxes filled to the brim with generous donations from the kind-hearted people that live in the local area, and

extremely helpful volunteers. The most donated item in the month of January was baked beans. There are 130 volunteers in Braintree who generously give up their time for the Foodbank.



Two of the workers that were there at the time were sorting out canned goods by date and type: baked beans, tinned tomatoes and tinned fruit.

There have been 72 tonnes of items (which is the weight of one and a half of a large Tesco's delivery lorry) given to 7408 people in the district since April 2022. The Foodbank counts the amount of food they have had to donate to families from April to

April and this year has been by far the most given. This shows the impact inflation has

had on families.

There were four types of food boxes that you could get, there were AF (family of four or five), BF (which was a family of 3), S (which is for a single parent) and X (which is a couple with no children). The delivery van they own goes to different local food stores -or known as shops- such as Tesco's, Sainsbury's, Lidl, Asda and M&S. Some of the foods that had been donated had originally been opened, tried, not liked and donated.

We were informed that there are many branches connecting to that Foodbank in Braintree. There is one in Great Notley, Witham, Halsted and two in Braintree.
